One goal of the TeRRItoria project is to collect relevant data in order to provide a complete and structured picture of the RRI and R&I landscape in each of the five involved territories for the transformative experiments. The TeRRItoria consortium developed a set of mapping tools that provides explanation and guidelines for the application of the mapping tools in terms of scope, process, objectives and intended results.

In the framework of the TeRRitoria project, a Map of Territorial Milieux was developed by using the approach of the desk research. The project partners reviewed existing public information, websites, and policy documents. Therefore, the partners collected and structured qualitative data focused on actors, experiences, factors and policies. During the mapping in the participating territories a total of 159 actors and stakeholders and 93 RRI-oriented related practises were mapped.

For each experiment a coherent picture of the current status of their structure, demographics and local R&I across was drawn.
